The king and queen of Troy receive an ominous prophecy about their unborn son but are thwarted in their desire to kill him when he is born.

Priamus rex Troiae est, Hecuba regina. dei somnium Hecubae dant. in somnic
Hecuba facem parit. postridie Hecuba ad templum ambulat. in templo
sacerdos ‘somnium’ inquit ‘nuntius a deis est. puer tuus periculum portat. puer
exitium Troiae est.’
